Looking Back at Lincoln by Bill Groom

I recently went to see the new movie, Lincoln, and I highly recommend it. It centers upon a relatively short span in Lincoln's presidency, January of 1865, and tells of the struggle to pass the thirteenth amendment to the Constitution, dealing with slavery. With the end of the Civil War then approaching, Lincoln feared that the federal courts might eventually undermine emancipation in ensuing years.

Watching the movie, I was reminded of a token, a political medalet, issued during the 1860 election when Lincoln ran for his first term. It was the then recently founded Republican party which championed freedom for slaves. Lincoln had to tread lightly on this issue though so as to succeed in his bid for the presidency. It was not until 1863 that Lincoln delivered his famous speech and delivered the Emancipation Proclamation.



Historians have long debated the causes of the Civil War. As a child, I recall teachers telling me that freeing the slaves was not a principal cause for the war. The conflict was more about states' rights, differing political sentiments and opposing economic and social ways of life, agricultural versus industrial. Now an adult, I no longer believe everything that the teachers and school books presented to me. The Lincoln movie and the above medalet tell me otherwise. The war was about freedom and enforcing the principles of a true republic. As the movie so well portrayed, Lincoln had to tread through a political minefield in order to take a giant step toward making all men equal.
